I. Standard Reports:

CCCAOE: Robert Cabral has been elected Associate Treasurer and will be transitioning out of his role as regional vice president. We are also losing Christina as our regional associate vice president.

The organization hasn't taken a position about the new online college. Their annual retreat planning session in Newport Beach in mid-July. Robert will report back. CCCAOE wants to have connections to the CTE liaisons. The list that the State Academic Senate has as CTE liaisons is different than our region's list. They said they will recognize our list.

Fall and Spring conferences are scheduled. Release will be July 10, 2018. At the last conference there were 550 registered with 25% faculty. Grant Gould will be offering scholarship opportunities for faculty to attend.

CCCAOE Leadership Academy is under the direction of Tessa Miley. A second tier Leadership Academy II is in the works. It was suggested to Amy Christiansen that all of the Leadership Academy be sequential in conjunction with the conference.

JSPAC: Josepha Baca shared that November 28-30 will be the annual conference in Sacramento with an emphasis on access and equity. Josepha's three-year term will be up this Fall. Anyone who is interested should respond to an email from her. Representatives can be faculty or deans. Will hear first-hand from representatives of the Chancellor's Office.

REGIONAL CHAIRS: Luann shared that our calls are all things Strong Workforce and NOVA. The All Hands Key Talent meeting will be in Sacramento on June 26. Will take your feedback on the regional planning process.

Robert mentioned that he and Josepha reached out to Paula and Gayla to hold a region-wide Business advisory meeting. There were more than 47 attendees at the meeting hosted at the Crowne Plaza in Ventura. Robert also attended the Digital Media Conference hosted at College of the Canyons. The next one will be held in the Bay Region.

PROGRAM RECOMMENDATIONS: Adele has shared that she's received 22 requests around program recommendation data. Ventura will be submitting Technical Theatre and Business Information Worker. Moorpark will be expanding in the creation of new noncredit certificates.

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Antelope Valley will be combining courses to create an electronics certificate and one on cyber security.

Regional Chairs will send an email clarifying whether taking existing courses and creating a new certificate needs to go to the region.

II. KEY TALENT UPDATES: Note: The DSN update PPT and any associated handouts will be posted to the website. Idea for the future—talk for 5 minutes about something exciting and/or new and provide a handout with bullet points of all the other things they are doing.

HEALTH: John Cordova will be transitioning to Sector Navigator as of July 1. A new DSN will not be hired until the first of the year. John will bring in two Project Coordinators to assist him during the interim period. John reported on his 16-17 projects which are completed. The Scrubs Camps were events for middle and high school students to learn from professionals. July 16th hosting a meeting in Oakland with health HR directors and on August 3rd will be a health summit at the Crowne Plaza in Ventura.

ADVANCED MANUFACTURING: Mike Bastine shared a video showcasing CNC training with a group of high functioning individuals with autism (uniquely abled). Employment preparation was included in the training. Renee offered to help recruit females to the program. John Cordova suggested to Josepha about having Mike be on the panel at the next JSPAC conference.

AGRICULTURE: Holly reported that she is working on her 18-19 budget items. They have a student internship program with Cal Poly and Cuesta students working on the Cal Poly farm and receiving credit. Holly will provide support financially to do the program. She is working on a summer research program through the Cal Poly Ag Department for next summer. In May she did a farm tour for Cuesta, Cal Poly and Allan Hancock. It will be replicated in the Fall. She is planning to offer support for high school programs and hopes to partner with some of the new K12 SWP funds. Working on statewide Ag conference support with other Ag DSNs and the Sector Navigator.

GLOBAL TRADE: Julie Samson shared a PPT with her projects which is attached to these minutes. Projects included Global Manufacturing for Startups, the Global T shirt program. She mentioned the “Global from the Get-Go Challenge” and the Global Trade Profile. All of the students who have been through the T shirt module will be invited to the Get-Go Challenge. She held a Global E-Commerce Summit in May and will be doing an Export Commerce Deep Dive.

ICT/DM: Paula Hodge reported on the Virtual Lab project earlier in the retreat. Now all 8 colleges are participating in the project. Other regions have implemented NetLab which is a bit different from Virtual Labs. The beauty of VL is the 24/7 support and colleges not being responsible for the hardware. Virtual Labs is hosted in the cloud and not at a college, and can add as many students as we want on demand. Gamification may be a solution for Cyber Security. There is expertise in each of the colleges to write the curriculum. Jerry brought out that now we must discuss how each student can have the proper device. The Allan Hancock bookstore rents equipment to students. By December Paula will be reporting on what has worked and not worked at the colleges. IT staff has also participated.

Paula is working with COC and Ventura College on the Digital Badge project. She would like to do micro-regional Solutions Summits. High schools are engaged in the Cyber Patriots program.

SMALL BUSINESS: Gayla reported on her PPT which is attached to these minutes. She has done Business Coaching Certification Training, and has helped the high schools doing Entrepreneurship dual enrollment

courses. She has run summer boot camps and infused of contextualized entrepreneur curriculum into courses.
