MINUTES

I. Program Approvals

Luann distributed a memo dated October 18, 2018 from the Chancellor's Office re: Curriculum Update from Jackie Escajeda.

Cuesta had several programs sent back from the CO saying they needed regional recommendations for long-standing programs. John asked to explore ways with the regional deans to make recommendations as a fast track with less paperwork, but recommendation approval noted in the SCCRC minutes.

Luann shared that on the recent Regional Chairs call, there was confusion about substantive changes and when they needed regional recommendation approval.

Margaret said that as more units are added to a certificate, going from a locally-approved certificate to a Chancellor's Office Certificate of Achievement (making it an official "new program"), it should have LMI and show regional discussion and recommendation.

Perkins V is big on transition from K12 to college, equity, etc., but because CA doesn't allow for Perkins to pay for student clubs and travel, CCCAOE could possibly advocate for this as the feds allow it.
