 - Next week will be the fourth symposium for [Behavioral Health Career Awareness](#). Governor Newsom recently signed the Peer Support Specialist bill (SB803). This bill is meant to standardize training curriculum for this position and allow for MediCal billing which should open up positions throughout the state. This Certificate is a good stepping stone for undergraduates into this career pathway.
 - Partnered with Mental Health Technology Center, funded by SAMHSA for a Cultural Linguistic training on October 30th from 9:00 to 10:30 discussing industry competencies students need so they are prepared to enter industry.

All California community colleges participate in the CTEOS. Underwritten by the Chancellor's Office, the CTEOS surveys former career education students to assess the success of their employment outcomes. Data collected includes pre- and post-education wages, how long it takes students to find a job after they leave the college, and whether they are working within their field of study. In its eighth year, and fourth year in which all community colleges participate, the data set offers a wealth of information available to use to improve CTE education on both the local and the statewide level.

Every year, the CTEOS holds their Research Academy to help community college professionals understand what the CTEOS is and how to use the data. Normally hosted on the Petaluma Campus at the Santa Rosa Junior College, 2020 is our first Virtual Academy. Additional sessions currently open for registration are below. All workshops are multi-part series working with the same participants over 2 to 3 sessions.
