MINUTES

- 9:00 – 9:10am Welcome and introductions.

- 9:10 - 9:20 am Celebrations - Good News
- CA FWD: 2020 California Economic Summit presented the 2020 [Partnerships for Industry and Education \(PIE\) contest](#) awards honoring innovative employer-education partnerships that are successfully preparing the workforce to meet the needs of the California economy. Two of the top three awards were from the South Central Coast region: (1) Ventura Unified School District's [STEMbassadors](#) (2) [SLO Partners](#)
 - Dr. Julius Sokenu, Interim President at Moorpark College will be speaking at our **Feb 19 SCCRC meeting** on this work with the statewide CEO Racial, Equity and Inclusive Excellence Taskforce and how MC is responding to Chancellor Oakley's Call to Action.
 - Ventura County Work-Based Learning Consortium
 - Patricia Duffy from the Ventura WDB—said this is a collaborative project. They are doing a Ventura County Work-based Learning Project. An asset map is being created that include the colleges, Adult schools, and others.
 - The goal is to reduce working in siloes. They will have one document that will call out gaps.
 - Others
 - Christy Douglass, CTE Liaison from Moorpark College – They are participating in the CA Virtual Campus CTE Pathways Grant.
 - Through the course of the grant Moorpark aligned 17 CTE courses to their rubric, created others, and converted many to zero-cost textbook initiative.
 - They are a Peer online course review college. Christy offered to share more information with others as requested



- Debbie Newcomb, Dean at Ventura College shared that VC was also part of the Online Education Initiative (OEI) rubric and the grant. They now have multiple degrees that can be completed totally online. VC used some SWP funding for zero-cost textbooks.
- Nancy Jo Ward, CTE Liaison from Allan Hancock College said that AHC will now be participating in the OEI initiative. She also presented to the Career Ladders Project with data from our Center of Excellence regarding areas that are somewhat “pandemic proof.”

Regional Updates:

- California Community Colleges Association for Occupational Education (CCCAOE)
 - [Virtual Spring Conference](#) - March 2021
 - Harriet shared that the Spring conference registration is now open. It will be staggered over three weeks beginning the first week of March. There is a variety of registration options.
 - Both the Omni in Rancho Mirage and the Hyatt Sacramento are committed to working with CCCAOE going forward.
 - Regional VP: Nominations Due Dec 15. Nomination form is [HERE](#).
 - As of June, CCCAOE has open positions. Nominations are open now. Our regional VP position is open.
 - The person nominating someone is responsible to fill out the form.
 - Harriet has offered to serve, and Margaret Lau nominated her.
 - President and Communications Officer positions are also open.
- Joint Special Populations Advisory Committee (JSPAC)
 - Recent Virtual Conference
 - Debbie Newcomb attended a couple of sessions. She was able to watch the session headed by Renee Marshall on humanizing online teaching.
 - South Central Coast Regional Representation ([Advisory Committee Application](#)). There is an opening for an SCCRC representative. Robert Cabral has offered to serve. There are quarterly Zoom meetings: Feb 5th, 11am-1:30pm; April 30th, 11am – 1:30pm; June 4th, 9am-3pm). We could have an alternate representative and needs to be a community college member. If there are multiple applicants, we will vote at our January SCCRC meeting.
- Regional Chairs
 - Busy with the Round 3 K12 SWP.
 - There was an Extended Operations meeting this week and the Chancellor’s Office (CO) continues to share their vision of reimagining the regional work.
 - Margaret asked about what they are saying about the Vision Resource Center being updated with Workforce Economic Development Division (WEDD) webinars, etc. The latest is from October. She requested the WEDD PowerPoints be posted in addition to the recordings.
 - Margaret shared that the webinar on Creating your Best Internship Experience is the most recent.
 - Harriet said that the new NOVA project application is too onerous and that needs to be shared with the Chancellor’s Office. This is putting too much of a burden on the field.



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- Luann asked for written feedback from the field so that the Regional Chairs (RC's) can send it on to the CO. The CO won't get what they're actually wanting (outcome results) by giving the field more bureaucracy. Bureaucracy is an innovation killer.
- The RCs will ask the RC group if Harriet could come onto one of the next calls to share thoughts and get feedback from the group.
- Margaret added that SWP has much more accountability than other CO categorical funds.
- The RCs will invite Sheneui Weber (Vice Chancellor) and/or Sandra Sanchez (Assistant Vice Chancellor) of the WEDD division to one of our next SCCRC meetings.
- Key Talent
 - Adilene shared that the virtual internship is still going on. She is working with Port of Hueneme and their partners to see how the workforce has shifted as a result of the pandemic—especially around logistics. Early next year results will be shared.

 - This project will be completed by mid-January. Some quotes and photos will also be included in the SWP Plan.
- **Other SWP Project Updates**
 - Luann shared that Rock Pfothenauer from the Bay Region is creating reports that drill down to the program level. Rock is willing to speak to the Region and demonstrate these reports. Luann will get some examples from Rock to share with the group. Margaret added that faculty would be essential, so January isn't a good time.

K12 SWP

- Luann praised the Selection Committee (SC) for their work.
- Giselle shared that the Selection Committee reviewed 14 applications and all met the 75 point threshold. The SC awarded each LEA applicant their highest scored application (funding at 87.5% of ask for each). She complimented SC Chair, Robert Cabral and co-chair, Shallu Makan.
- Diane Walker shared some updates.
 - Association for Career Technical Education (ACTE) Vision Conference had over 5,000 in attendance. She would like to thank CCAOE's Eva Jimenez for presenting.
 - CTE month in February 2021. In the Antelope Valley, they are soliciting videos from their CTE Academies. Their regional Antelope Valley Economic Development will have a virtual conference Feb. 24th.

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- **Round 1 and Round 2 Fiscal and Data Reporting - Due Dec 18**
 - Giselle shared that there is frustration about the amount of reporting and requirements.
 - Having the CO at one of our SCCRC meetings would also allow K12 reporting challenges to be communicated.
- **K14 Technical Assistance Provider Update**
 - K12 SWP Round 3 feedback from the Selection Committee will come out after the first of the year.
 - Our region will also survey applicants by January.
 - The Pathway mapping efforts are continuing via the Pathway Coordinators. Useful information for high school and college counselors.
 - Luann mentioned that the CO has said there will be Round 4 K12 SWP possibly in the Spring.
 - We will be recruiting new Selection Committee members starting in January 2021.
 - Robert asked whether K12 SWP has any return-on-investment reporting. Giselle responded that for Round 1 all LEAs completed an Interim Measures Survey. The first official NOVA fiscal reporting must be completed by December 18th. **By May or June, the goal for our region will be to have clear data points re: outcomes and where students are going.**
 - Luann added that the CO is working on a more narrative section in NOVA as well as fiscal reporting.
 - Luann will be refining data requirements for match that will go out to the K12's today.

Notices of Intent & Program Recommendations

- **Notices of Intent (NOI)**- There are several new NOI's submitted since our last regional meeting of 11/13/20. All can be viewed [HERE](#).
- Reminder to review comments
- Voting happens virtually and there are comments in the voting module.
- Noncredit programs do not need to have official NOI, but we like to share at our meetings any new noncredit programs.
 - Moorpark College is completing two noncredit pathways. Creating a 45-hour noncredit certificate in Solar Technology that would be launched in Fall 2021.
 - MC is creating a Maker Space noncredit pathway that will be about 50-60 hours.
 - Robert said that Labor Market Information (LMI) is being requested for noncredit pathways, and if that data required to be submitted to the state. Harriet responded that depending on what area the noncredit program falls—for Career Development and College Preparation (CDCP), the narrative should contain



information about job placement. College of the Canyons uses their local advisory committees. Industry provides letters of support.

- Margaret added that at Allan Hancock College, Sofia has requested LMI from Adele at our Center of Excellence which has been provided. At AHC braided funding allowed them to partner with BW Research to conduct labor market report for northern Santa Barbara County adult education. The report will be out shortly and will be shared with the Region.
 - Luann added that SBCC's School of Extended Learning also contracted with BW Research for adult ed programs. **This will be shared with the Region.**
 - Adele said that it is fine to request data from our COE regarding noncredit programs. **The RC will let the Region know that this is fine.**
