**c. Center of Excellence**

- i. [The CA Future of Work Report](#) came out today and the COE's will be aligning it to the Resilient Jobs Report and Recovery with Equity Report
- ii. COEs have worked together to update the Program Recommendation Report. They are adding skills and certification pieces. Adele will be reaching out to the Career Education deans as to who on their campuses Adele should work with and provide training.
- iii. Question about the supply side data includes completions from 4-year universities—shouldn't it just be community college completions. Adele responded that when asked about "above-middle-skill jobs" the 4-year schools data is included.

**d. Regional Directors (RDs)**

Adv Mfg—Mike Bastine

- Ventura Manufacturing Council (will become its own nonprofit) but short-term they will partner with Economic Development Collaborative of Ventura County (EDCVC). Haas, Amgen, Behr Manufacturing as well as small business.
- The Ventura Avenue corridor has high unemployment and businesses have collaborated and now have a site donation, they are bringing in advanced manufacturing machines to be housed there for training. Aspire (community-based organization) will do employability skills training. Ventura College has been contacted. Suggested that he contact the Ventura Workforce Development Board to have staff onsite.

- June 21-25 will be a summer institute for high schoolers.
- Precision training through SLO Partners group. Equipment will be made available. Mike is working with Michael Speccheirla.
- Manufacturing day's Robotics Teams will begin working in August.

ICT/DM—Paula Hodge

- Reaching out to faculty to see how they are using the LinkedIn Learning in their canvas shells.
- Cybersecurity design thinking process (what K12 and colleges are already offering and identify gaps) - in May - business, public safety and computer networking—each area will have an industry person.
- Work with industry partners re: cyber privacy and risk awareness to create some collateral that faculty and employers can use re: comparison between physical world and digital world.
- In the home stretch for this fiscal year - contracts must be completed by April.

**4. SWP updates**

**a. Community College SWP**

- The Regional Chairs (RCs) met with CO program monitor, Nick Esquivel and will be meeting bi-weekly with him.
- The spend-down plans for rounds 1-3 were all approved by Nick.
- Amanda will send out an email the Monday prior to the meeting with Nick to ask if the region has any questions.
- Tessa will continue meet regarding “anything NOVA” on Thursday afternoons. We are tracking budgets and expenditures to match our Spending Plans.
- Request that the RCs remind Nick about certifying local Round 5 projects.
- Need acknowledgement of receipt of fiscal backup reports by
- The RCs discussed the status document with Nick last week based on the survey input each campus provided by Feb 19th.
- It appears that most of the colleges thought it was very probable to spend down all funds from Rounds 1-4 by December 31, 2021.

- b. Reported that at last week’s WEDD webinar Sandra Sanchez said that colleges would have until April 1<sup>st</sup> to submit spend-down plans and until April 2022 to expend. The RCs will double check on this. We need a Guidance Memo that can go to college business services departments.**



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### c. K12 SWP

- i. K12 Round 3 funding has come to the fiscal agent in apportionment and invoices will be processed once expanded budgets are certified in NOVA.
- ii. If either a college or K12 SWP grantee, the RCs need to know right away if you have funds that could be reallocated. You will be contacted.

### 5. PERKINS

- Question for Nick – will there be a grace period for spend-down of Perkins.
- The CA state Perkins plan was approved at the beginning of the year. Go to: <https://cte.ed.gov/dataexplorer/report>
- Section 2, part B form required from Perkins IV. The form is inadequate under Perkins V. It is now an irrelevant document. It is now the Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment document must be on file.

### 6. Other Announcements/Upcoming Meetings-Events

- a. Question asked about the competitive Regional Consortium RFA release. The RCs have been told that the competitive RFA will be out at the end of March with a 90-day turnaround and performance period beginning in January 2022.
- b. The statewide Regional Chairs group has sent the Chancellor's Office a spreadsheet with timelines that we need. So far – no response from the CO to populate the document.
- c. The Regional Directors (RDs) have been told to stop activities that cost money as of June 30<sup>th</sup> with EWD funds. If the RDs have SWP funds for projects they can continue working.
