2012 Top Certificate Programs

In our experience 18 months development time is about the right amount of time required to develop a certificate program. If you are also doing market research (audience, need, competition), you may spend up to 2-3 years, as long as you don't miss out on the market window or lose out to the competition. But the rule is the more time you can spend in market research, the better. In terms of developing a course, the average course takes 3-9 months to develop, with six months being a good average or plan. Below is information we gathered from our members last year.
